**3 SNELLING**, 1359 Seven Pines Rd., about two miles north of the town of Snelling; **(803) 259-4583**

**4 LANDFILL**, 155 Landfill Rd., four miles north of Barnwell, past the vocational school; **(803) 259-4582**


**5 HEALING SPRINGS**, 3287 Healing Springs Rd., one-half mile west of intersection of Hwy. 3 and Healing Springs Rd. in Blackville; **(803) 284-3753**

**6 ROSEMARY**, 963 Thorin Dr. at the intersection of Thorin Dr., Lake Dr. and Deering Rd.; one-half mile east of Rosemary Church in Williston; **(803) 266-4744**

**7 REEDY BRANCH**, 870 Reedy Branch Rd., three miles west of Hilda and one-half mile south of US 70; **(803) 259-4588**

**8 FIRE TOWER**, 7633 Hwy. 64, one mile east of Barnwell; **(803) 259-4598**

**9 SPUR BRANCH**, 8360 Springfield Hwy., two miles north of Williston at intersection of Hwy. 39 and S-6-32; **(803) 266-2985**



## Why recycle?

- **TO SAVE NATURAL RESOURCES**
  - ▶ For each ton of recycled glass used to make new glass, nine gallons of fuel are saved.
  - ▶ 58 percent less water is used to make recycled paper than when using raw materials.
- **TO SAVE ENERGY**
  - ▶ Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a television for three hours.
  - ▶ Two gallons of recycled motor oil have enough energy to run the average household for 24 hours.
- **TO SAVE LANDFILL SPACE**
  - ▶ Landfills are expensive to build and maintain. Why put recyclables in the landfill? Save valuable landfill space.

## Recycle used motor oil, filters & more!

The following petroleum products **ARE ACCEPTED** and may be put into the used oil collection tank:

- motor oil;
- hydraulic fluid;
- gear oil;
- diesel fuel;
- fuel oil;
- kerosene;
- automatic transmission fluid; and
- power steering fluid.

The following petroleum products **CANNOT BE PLACED** in the used oil collection tanks:

- antifreeze;
- Varsol;
- brake fluid;
- paint (oil and latex);
- paint thinner;
- refrigeration oil; and
- any solvent cleaner or substance used to clean paint brushes.

**OIL FILTERS MUST BE DRAINED.**  
Allow 24 hours for oil to be completely removed from filter.

CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS	Lumber, shingles, windows, doors, brick, block, concrete		All Recycling Centers
FARMER OIL	Motor oil from farm machinery	Limit 55 gallons per visit.	Landfill
GLASS	Clear, green and brown (bottles and jars only)	Discard lids, rinse containers.	All Recycling Centers
OIL/GAS MIXTURE			Landfill
MAGAZINES, NEWSPAPERS AND INSERTS	Dry newspapers and inserts as well as magazines.	Do not tie or bag.	All Recycling Centers
MIXED OFFICE PAPER	Office paper, white and color		All Recycling Centers
OIL, FILTERS AND BOTTLES	Used motor oil, oil filters and oil bottles (oil must be free of gas or diesel fuel)		All Recycling Centers; see "More to Know" for additional locations.
PLASTIC	Soft drink, milk and other narrow-neck plastic bottles marked by a number 1 -7 recycling symbol (usually found on the bottom). <b>NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM.</b>	Discard caps, rinse and flatten. Labels do not need to be removed.	All Recycling Centers
TEXTILES	Clothing, shoes and belts		All Recycling Centers
TIRES	Passenger vehicle tires		All Recycling Centers
YARD TRIMMINGS	Brush from yards, limbs, trees		All Recycling Centers

## Recycle used motor oil!

Used motor oil, oil filters and empty motor oil bottles are frequently improperly disposed of. One gallon of used motor oil poured on the ground or in a sewer system can contaminate as much as 1 million gallons of water – often the very water we drink.

To make recycling easy and convenient, all Barnwell County Recycling Centers accept used motor oil for recycling. In addition, the landfill accepts oil/gasoline mixture.
